1. Report Purpose

The purpose of this report is to highlight the 2015-16 college performance indicators.

The Scottish Funding Council produce an annual report on performance across the college sector including overall data on attainment and retention and information by individual college, which is published by each college on their website. Below the high level figures, the college curriculum teams analyse results at programme level and use the self-evaluation process to identify strengths, concerns and areas for action.
