#### 1. Report Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on the current levels of applications to our courses which will begin in the academic session 2017/18

#### 3. Background

In line with the other two colleges in Glasgow, we opened our website for applications for full time courses on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2017.

The attached sheet shows that, by 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2017, we have received 6,028 applications for courses. An extract from the minutes of the Learning and Teaching committee on 17 February 2016 indicates that, at 8<sup>th</sup> February 2016, 8,710 applications had been received. At a rate of circa 400 – 500 applications per day, the lower total for this year's applications may simply be a matter of timing with this year's snapshot 5 days earlier than last year.

The applications for Engineering courses is again in line with expectation; a significant portion of their activity is through employers and applications are not made in the same way as more "traditional" full time courses.

We will continue to monitor the applications on a regular basis, and, where necessary, marketing will ensure that actions are taken to drive traffic to our website.

The admissions team continue to work hard processing these applications as quickly as possible
