The purpose of this report is to inform the Committee of the Student Induction audit carried out this academic session.

3. Background

The attached paper summarises the findings of an internal audit to determine the effectiveness of the Student Induction process. A total 41 courses were audited (639 completed questionnaires were returned from a possible 793 students – a return rate of 81%). From the findings it can be concluded that Student Induction is well organised and effectively documented.
