1. Report Purpose

The purpose of this report is to inform the committee of the credit audit for 2016-17 carried out on behalf of the SFC.

2. Recommendations

The Learning and Teaching committee are asked to note the report.

3. Background

In 2016-17 the college delivered 128,696 credits which was 1.2% above its core target. No issues were identified that required a recommendation for improvement to be made. The full Further Education Statistics (FES) report provided the following breakdown of activity:

- 65% of activity at FE level (SCQF levels 1 to 6)
- 30% of activity are learners from the 10% most deprived postcodes (SIMD 10)
- 71% of credit activity is from learners aged 16-24 years old
- 1106 school-college learners (19% of part-time FE enrolments)
- 14% of activity is in price group 5
- 23% of credit activity delivered in STEM subjects

4. Risk Analysis

Inability to meet the college's credit target is a significant risk in terms of core funding. The importance of strong recruitment and a reduction in Early Withdrawal will continue to support this.
